Life in T4C camp

All 1200 participants will be subdivided into 10 villages. Each village will be made up of approximately 100 participants from various organisations.

During the village days, villages will organise games and activities for their village or for others who want to join. Also local trips can be arranged (around the lake, walks in the countryside, etc.)

In each week, there will be 'Global' days and 'village' days.

Global days (GD) - days when you can expect central programme planned by the T4C team. It will include many kinds of workshops and freetime activities.

Programme

The programme is aimed at people between the ages of 10 and 20, this means that the majority of your group should be in this age group.

Participants will be subdivided into 3 main groups and all activities are created for three different age groups: up to 12, 13 – 16 and 17 upwards.

Activities will be focused on non-verbal communication where possible and informal translation will be provided.

Village days (VD) - days when each village will run activities planned in co-operation with the village coordinator and T4C team. For example trips, matches, etc.



Train program

The 31st of July will be a very exciting day in the camp. All 1200 participants will travel together on a very special train from Döbriach to Jedovnice, guess what a name of the train is - right! It the "train for change"

What can you expect on the train?

Music in the disco-wagon, workshops carriages, games carriages, tasks, discussions, and lots of fun!

Language isn't a problem in T4C!

It's no problem to come to the camp with children who can't speak English.

Children don't always need language to communicate.

The workshops will be arranged in a way that you don't need to communicate with words too much. Working languages are English, German, Spanish, and Czech.

Member of a theme team

Volunteers in the theme teams will undertake several tasks – communicating with workshop leaders, contributing to the theme developing process and creating the exact contents of the workshops. A job for those with expertise as well as those with a lot of energy, ideas and enthusiasm!

Workshop leaders

Workshop leaders will run the workshops on the camp for the different age-groups. Workshops can be led by people from the theme team, by external experts or by people from member organisations. If you want to run a workshop as a new experience and to improve your skills, you are welcome!

Village coordinators

We are looking for volunteers who are willing to take responsibility for ensuring the villages are inclusive, friendly and smooth-running. These people can be from any member organisation but should not have major group responsibilities at the camp.

There will be two coordinators in each village. One for technical matters and one to support the village programme development.

- >>taking part in co-ordination meetings every day
- >>communicating with the central team
- >>communicating with groups in their village, running the morning circles
- tech>>coordination of central volunteers from their village for different tasks each day
- prog>>taking a supportive role in developing the concrete village programme

How to get to the Train 4 Change Camp and the costs

The best airport to arrive to is Vienna International airport, but there are also smaller airports in Salzburg and Graz.

Arrival:

From Vienna airport the best route to the camp will be:

- 1) Vienna airport line Bus 1187 in front of the airport to Meidling station: 6,- € per person
- 2) train Meidling station - Villach: 29,60 € for adults / 14,80 € for under 19s
- 3) in Villach you will be picked up by a bus (included in the campfee)
- 4) return from Brno – Vienna is included in the camp price

From Salzburg airport to SPITTAL:

- 1) bus from Salzburg airport to Salzburg train station: 2,- €
- 2) train Salzburg – Spittal: 15,40 € for adults and 7,70 € for u19s –
- 3) In Spittal you will be picked up by a bus (included in the camp-fee)
- 4) to Vienna you take the included shuttle
- 5) train to Salzburg from Vienna Westbahnhof to Salzburg: 28,50 € for adults / 14,30 € for u19s

Departure:

- 1) from Jedovnice/Brno to Vienna airport there will be a shuttle (included in the campfee)
- 2) from Brno to Prague:
 - >> By bus: 8 € for adults, 6,5 € for students, 4 € for children
 - >> By train: group discount - first 2 persons 10€, another persons 6€ (max for 30 persons)

We will help you with the booking and try to solve all your travel problems.

The Camp fee is 250 €. Reductions of the camp fee and travel support will be offered for Non-Europeans and Eastern European participants – ask the IFM-Camp Info-helpline: info@trainforchange.info

The Camp fee covers food, accommodation and programme in Döbriach and Jedovnice as well as the special train between the two sites. It also covers a shuttle from Villach or Spittal to Döbriach and a shuttle from Jedovnice to Vienna at the end of the camp. Finally, the camp fee includes a solidarity contribution to the travel costs and participation fund for those coming from further away.
